## January 24, 1902; Lost Creek No. 2 Mine, Oskaloosa, Iowa; 20 Killed

(From State inspector's report, 1903, pp. 47-30)

The explosion \* \* \* occurred \* \* \* about noon. \* \* \* air had been well conducted \* \* \* and \* \* \* it had been the practice to slow down the fan just before \* \* \* and until completion of the firing. The explosion started in room No. 10 on the 2d north \* \* \*, which had been driven only 50 feet and so had no breakthroughs connecting with adjacent rooms.

\* \* \* the miner had charged 2 holes; 1 hole only was fired. The shot blew through into an old drill hole, \* \* \* flaming gases were ejected into the room. \* \* \* the dust stirred up in this room by the firing of the shot and ignited by the flaming gases increased the initial force of the explosion considerable. There were \* \* \* 20 dead and 14 injured.
