Found With Rake.

Armed with a rake they returned to the uarry and probed about in the water. After a short time, the prongs of the rake became entangled in the clothing of one of the boys, and the body was dragged to the surface. The other body was located a short time later.

Meanwhile, Lieutenant Ray and Corporal Cole of the state highway police, had been notified, and they, with Detectives McDaniel and Wilson, hurried to the scene with grappling irons. The bodies had been found before they arrived at the quarry. Coroner Nichols was summoned and he took charge of the bodies, later releasing them to their families.

Both boys are the only sons in the Kempski and Nitchie families. William Nitchie lived with his mother, who is divorced from her husband. The two boys had been playmates practicaly all of their lives, and where one was the other could usually be found. Both tok their first holy communion together last year at St. Elizabeth's Church. Paul yas a pupil at No. 19 School, while the Nitchie boy was a pupil at St. Elizabeth's School.

Funeral services for the two boys will be held Wednesday morning from St. Elizabeth's R. C. Church.
