

MINE EXPLORER DIES IN CAVE-IN

Three Persons Hurt In Old Shaft At Keyesville

BAKERSFIELD, Calif., May 27.
—Exploration of an old tunnel in the Keyes mine, near Keyesville, 50 miles east of here, has resulted in the death of one man and the narrow escape of three others, who were seriously injured.

Salvadore Acosta, 25, was drowned Sunday when several tons of rock caved in and water from an old shaft rushed over him. Charles Knowles, Joseph Denchok and Herbert Lee, although injured, managed to pull themselves to safety.

The mine, owned by C. C. Randall of Los Angeles, is one of the oldest in Kern county, having been operated at intervals since 1844.
