## "BLACK DAMP"

## Loses Two Victims.

Rescuers Save Men From Death In Abandoned Coal Mine— Found In Delirium.

Charleston, W. Va., September 18—(AP)—Two half-nude men, so crazed by hours of exposure to "black damp" that they tore off most of their clothing, were rescued today from an abandoned coal mine by crews wearing oxygen helmets.

The men were rushed to a hospital at Montgomery, where attaches said Earl Mason, 21 years old, Morris Creek, had been placed under an oxygen tent. Both Mason and his companion, Elmer Gay, 33, Montgomery, are expected to recover. They were in the mine for 16½ hours.

The men told hospital attendants that they entered the old mine to obtain coal for their families.

Rescue crews found Gay and Mason sitting with their backs against the wall of the mine, in a delirium. They had torn off their caps, mining lamps, shoes, and shirts, the engineer related, and were "nearly dead."

"Apparently there was just barely enough oxygen in the air to keep them alive," Houtz said.
