Teacher Dies In Mine Shaft Fall

MONROE — A 22-year-old physical education teacher lost his life Sunday when he apparently slipped from a rope and fell in a 100-foot abandoned mine shaft.

State Police at Monroe said Walter Kersavage had tied a rope to a tree and was attempting to lower himself down the shaft when he slipped.

Kersavage taught at the Mc-Quad Foundation, an orphanage in Route 94 outside Newburgh.

Police said he was hiking with a group of boys from the orphanage.

Kersavage lived in Central Valley.
