

Eastside man drowns in limestone quarry

Two persons died in water-related accidents in Indiana over the weekend, including an Indianapolis man who drowned in an abandoned Monroe County limestone quarry.

Stephen Ray Walters, 33, of 3846 North Hartman Drive, dived into the quarry, located west of Bloomington, late Saturday night and never resurfaced, police said.

Divers from the Indiana Department of Natural Resources recovered his body from 18 feet of water early Sunday.

Charles L. Boyd, 17, of Farmersburg, drowned Sunday morning while swimming with friends in Lake Sullivan in Sullivan County.

An autopsy revealed that Boyd suf-

fered head injuries and broken ribs when he fell into the water about 2 a.m.

Friends pulled him from the water and tried to revive him, but he died an hour later in Mary Sherman Hospital at Sullivan.

The Sullivan County Sheriff's Department said the death was accidental.

Services for Mr. Walters, a lifelong resident of Indianapolis, will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Flanner and Buchanan Shadeland Mortuary, where friends may call from 2 p.m. to 9 p.m. today.

He was a floral designer and wedding consultant for the Marer Flower Shop in Indianapolis more than seven years.

Survivors include his mother, Helen I. Walters, and two brothers, David A. and Michael J. Walters.
