

Teen Drowns In Dayton Gravel Pit

DAYTON, Ohio (AP) — Police say repeated rescue attempts by friends, two passing police officers and later paramedics weren't enough to save a Dayton teen-ager who drowned while swimming in a quarry.

Dayton Police Department Sgt. H.G. Perry said the officers pulled up to chase three boys out

of the quarry Monday afternoon when they realized that one was drowning.

Perry said the officers saw 13-year-old Ryan Howe's head go under for the last time as they arrived at the edge of the quarry, and dove in to save him. But Perry said the water in the quarry was 45 degrees and 25 to 30 feet deep.
