

Boy Drowns in Quarry Hole

Death by drowning in an abandoned quarry hole between Graniteville and Websterville was the fate of Freeman Clough, aged seven, who went berrying with other children of his own age Friday and accidentally slipped into the water. His comrades, after they realized what had happened to the Clough boy, spread the alarm, but in their excitement they were unable to point out which of several quarry holes claimed the lad as its victim. The body has since been recovered.

The boy was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Abraham Clough, former residents of Washington, who live in upper Graniteville.
