George Christian, 15 years old, 2230 Paris avenue, was swimming at 4:30 p. m., in a pond said to be 300 feet deep, in an abandoned quarry</p>	<p>at 4301 Ashland avenue, when he was seized with cramps.</p> <p>The body was recovered by a professional diver, who went 125 feet beneath the surface of the pond to find it. The pressure of the water at a depth of 100 feet is great and unusually heavy pieces of metal had to be worn on the diver's suit to weigh him down. It took the diver only eight minutes to find the body.</p> <p>Edward Fenton, 15 years old, a messenger boy, wading in the Mis-</p>	<p>issippi River at the foot of Cedar street, was swept away by the current and drowned.
