

INGLENOOK YOUTH DROWNS IN QUARRY WHEN FOOT SLIPS

BIRMINGHAM, May 19 — Stumbling while walking along the edge of an abandoned stone quarry near Inglenook late Monday afternoon, the 14-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Gus Nations, Water Street, Inglenook, fell into 50 feet of water and was drowned, according to police reports. At a late hour the body had not been recovered.

According to information gathered by police at Inglenook, the boy was returning home from an afternoon spent in the woods and was taking a short cut by the quarry, which has been filled with water in recent rains. His foot struck an obstruction of some sort, he lost his balance and dropped into the quarry before he could get a handhold on anything to check his plunge.

Police from Birmingham and from the Inglenook station and attaches of John's spent some time dragging for the body, but at a late hour had not recovered it. Volunteer workers were aiding the police in their search.
