

STORMS RELIEVE SATURDAY HEAT

13-Year-Old Boy Drowns in Swimming Hole at West Seneca

Threatening showers and thunderstorms, predicted by Weatherman Andrew P. Keller, today lowered a sizzling temperature which Saturday drove thousands of Buffalonians to cool country places and resulted indirectly in one death.

This marks the fourth consecutive weekend that Buffalo and vicinity has experienced showers and thunderstorms.

The thermometer throughout most of Saturday hovered around 80, reaching a high of 82 at 5 p. m. The lowest temperature was 68 at 8 a. m.

Seeking to escape the withering heat in a swimming "hole" in an abandoned quarry near West Seneca, yesterday, cost the life of Edward Subinski, 13, of 37 Sweet avenue.

The boy had been swimming for nearly an hour when he was suddenly seized by cramps, police say. Several of his friends made futile attempts to bring him ashore.
