PALMERTON YOUTH DROWNS IN QUARRY

Joins Party of Boys In Search of Worms for Fishing and Meets Death.

Going out to get grass for his rabbits, but joining a party of boys in search of worms for fishing, Frank, 12-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Horvath, of Palmerton, was drowned in water in an abandoned slate quarry hole at Aquashicola, near the western border of Monroe county.

Horvath's father called Dr. Mahlon Wertman, of Palmerton, and with others went to the scene of the accident. The body was soon retrieved from the water and brought to the surface. There was evidence of life, but after a gasp, the doctor pronounced the lad dead, despite desperate efforts with artificial respiration.

The parents and three sisters and three brothers survive.

The funeral will take place on Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock.
