

## ENRAGED BULL KILLS MAN

Barre Center Beast Maddened By Storm  
—Youth Drowns in Quarry.

ALBION, June 15.—Driven mad by the electric storm Sunday, a three-year-old bull killed Broadwell S. Noble, 60, prominent Barre Center farmer, on the Noble farm.

Mr. Noble left the house at 7 P. M. to do the chores. When, after two hours he had not returned, an investigation was made. His body was found in the bull pen, the bull raging over it. The animal was killed and Mr. Noble's body recovered.

Mr. Noble was one of the best known farmers in the township of Barre. He leaves his wife, Clara, and a daughter, Frances.

Frank Panex, 17, who resided on Drake island, four miles southwest of Barre Center, and who was engaged in muck crop growing, was drowned Sunday in the Culver quarry west of Barre Center. He slipped off a raft on which several boys were paddling around the abandoned quarry. The body was recovered several hours later. Panex was the oldest of a family of nine children.
