

Seek \$75,000 Damages For Death Of Youth

Trial of the \$75,000 damage action brought in general court by O. L. Fitzgerald, administrator of the estate of Tommy Ham, against Philip S. Henry, started yesterday with Judge Guy Weaver presiding.

The administrator is seeking to recover for the death of Tommy Ham, 8, who was drowned in June, 1931, in an abandoned rock quarry pool on the Henry estate on Beaucatcher mountain. The complaint alleges the defendant was negligent in allowing water to stand in the rock quarry, and that beauties of the estate "allured and attracted" the Ham child.
