WRIGHTSVILLE BOY DROWNS IN QUARRY

The body of James Harmon, nine, of Wrightsville, missing since 6 P. M. Thursday, was recovered at 3:15 P. M. Friday in the depths of Crumling's quarry in Wrightsville.

Searching parties scoured the river hills all Thursday night, but the search turned to the abandoned quarry Friday morning after Irvin White, twelve-year-old chum of the Harmon boy, admitted that the missing lad had fallen into the water while they were fishing Thursday evening.

Searchers grappled for the body from boats until mid-afternoon, when it was brought to the surface. The water in the quarry is nearly 30 feet deep.

The White boy said he was too frightened to say anything about the drowning Thursday night.

Coroner L. U. Zech, of York, after a brief investigation issued a verdict of death by drowning.

The victim is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Harmon, and these brothers and sisters: Charles, George, Warren, John, Mary, Emma and Elinor, all at home.
