

HANOVER YOUTH NEARLY DROWNS

Woodrow Forry, 19, Drawn
Into Vortex While Swim-
ming In Quarry Hole

SAVED BY FOUR BOYS

Hanover, May 26.—Woodrow Forry, 19-year-old son of Isaac Forry, Baltimore street, was rescued from drowning in 30 feet of water in Hartman's ore bank quarry, near Smith's Station, this afternoon at 7 o'clock when he became engulfed in a suction whirl. Four young boys who were swimming at the same place saved him.

The boys who effected the rescue were Robert Miller, aged 15 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. Mark Miller, Baer avenue; Orville James, 13-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Maurice James, Baltimore street; Robert Martin, Broadway, and LaMarr Strevig, Baer avenue, 15-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Strevig.

Forry, a cripple, was swimming about 25 feet from shore when he became engulfed in the vortex of a suction whirl of water. He went under the surface three times before the boys, manning a raft, reached him.

His call for help sent the fellow swimmers to his aid. A raft, kept in the body of water, was immediately pressed into service. Robert Miller found Forry under the surface by diving into the water near where Forry had been last seen.

Forry was in an unconscious condition when taken ashore. Artificial respiration was applied and the victim soon recovered. Forry is able to swim but was unable to overcome the force of the whirlpool. While young, Forry suffered with infantile paralysis which has left him a cripple.
