

AWARDED CARNEGIE MEDAL FOR HEROISM

PITTSBURGH, Pa., May 2 —
(ANP) At the spring meeting of
the Carnegie Hero Fund Com-
mission., held here Friday, April
27, twenty-four acts of heroism
were recognized, a bronze medal
being awarded in each case.
Among them being:

Rescued Drowning Woman

Athur E. Brown, 476 Park ave-
nue, Tyrone, Pa. who received a
bronze medal. Mr. Brown, aged
twenty-four, laborer, saved Mrs.
Beatrice V. White, also colored,
aged 31, from drowning, Ironville,
Pa., September 5, 1932. While
wading in water in an abandoned
quarry, Mrs. White lost her foot-
ing at a point seven feet from
the bank and was submerged in
water ten feet deep. She rose
threshing and drifted to a point
twelve feet from the bank.
Brown dived from a rock at the
other side of the quarry and with
great exertion swam eighty-five
feet to Mrs. White. As he tried to
take hold of her, she threw her
arms around his neck; and both
were submerged. Under water
Brown broke her hold. Both rose.
Brown then took hold of her and
with difficulty swam twelve feet
to the bank.
