THREE BOYS ON ICE DROWN IN COUNTY

York, Feb. 19.—Three York county boys drowned yesterday, two in an abandoned quarry hole near Hanover, the third at Loucks Mill. Attempting to walk across the ice at Loucks Mill, Sherwood Potts, 9, son of Mr. and Mrs. Malvern Potts, North York, drowned when a large cake of ice loosened and floated away. The ice cake tilted and the boy fell into the water.

Russell S. Lauer, Dover; Frederick Heisley and Grant C. Whisler plunged into the river and rescued the youth who was rushed to the York Hospital, where resuscitation efforts failed.

Skating on an abandoned quarry hole, the ice of which suddenly broke, two Hanover boys, schoolmates, both 10 years of age, were drowned in 15 feet of water. The victims were: Junior Hinkle, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hinkle, and Clyde Whisler, son of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Whisler. The bodies were recovered by Hanover firemen.
