## Louis J. Farry Felled on Boardwalk; Cliffwood Lad Sinks in Quarry

## TWO COMPANIONS NEAR COLLAPSE IN WATER

Temperature Up to 89 Here, with Little or No Letup Seen Yet

A drowning and a heat prostration case that proved fatal yesterday were marked against the heat wave that entered its third day today without visible signs of relief.

Seeking relief from the high temperatures and higher humidity readings, Alfred Denardo, 17, of Cliff-wood, lost his life while swimming in an abandoned clay quarry.

Louis J. Farry, 58, dropped dead on the boardwalk at Bradley Beach, the victim of a heart attack which physicians said was induced by the heat.

The highest thermometer reading here yesterday was 90 degrees taken at 11:48 A. M., and the figure remained unchanged for a two hour period. The mercury fell off during the early afternoon but the decrease brought little relief as the humidity soared to 90 per cent at 2 o'clock.

Predicting a continution of the heat wave, William D. Martin, local observer for the U. S. weather bureau, said the high pressure area extending over the eastern section of the country, in which Long Branch is located, has moved but slightly.

South or southwest winds, with little cooling effect were expected to prevail today and a temperature range of from 72 to 90 degrees was predicted for today and tomorrow.

The only hope held out to the stifling shore in Martin's report was the indication that the mercury would not reach the 97 degree record, established for this date in 1930.

mishap occurred in the old clay quarry of Oswald's Brick Yard at Cliffwood. Filled with water, the deep pit of late has been a popular "swmming hole."

Denard, with Tony Gallo, 18, and Joseph Rosato, 17, both of Cliffwood, at 12:30 o'clock set out to swim across the flooded pit, which is about 50 yards across. None of the trio could swim very well.

In the center of the deep pool, Denardo suddenly turned to his companions, and gasped that he was too tired to go on. The other lads grabbed their friend and endeavored to reach shore with him, but their unexpertness in the water made it impossible for them to progress far and they became dangerously exhausted. Their grip on Denardo was relaxed, and the lad went below the surface of the water.

Desperately struggling for the life of their companion, the two dived and pulled Denardo to the surface again, but they were forced to see their playmate sink once more, barely having strength enough to make shore themselves.

First Aid Squads from Keyport, Matawan, and Lawrence Harbor, and state police from Keyport barracks soon arrived and search for the body began. It was recovered at 1:45 by the Keyport squad, and artificial resuscitation was begun.
