BUD PALLARDY DROWNS AS HIS FRIENDS WATCH

Slips Into Deep Water In Gardner Rock Quarry Yesterday Afternoon After Scuffling Match,

Francis (Bud) Pallardy, 19year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Pallardy of 533 Emmons avenue, was drowned in the Gardner rock quarry at 3:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon when he fell from a rock ledge after scuffling with a friend.

The drowning occurred in about 20 feet of water. The body was recovered about seven o'clock by Joe Wyhs who used grappling hooks.

Pallardy and Elmer Silverberg had been wrestling on the rock ledge about four inches above the water level, witnesses said, and Pallardy shoved Silverberg into the water. Silverberg swam a short distance out into the quarry and when he looked around he saw the form of Pallardy disappearing below the surface.

Bud, who could swim very little, went to the quary with four or five friends, all of whom are good swimmers. Two of his friends were on a diving platform on the opposite side of the quarry when they heard the calls of excited swimmers. Frank Hanslick made several attempts to dive to the bottom of the quarry but the pool was too deep.

The Gardner quarry is used daily during the summer time by bathers. At one time, swimmers were barred from the place because it is dangerous. The water is very deep and the sides are vertical.

There is some talk of again prohibiting the use of the quarry for swimming purposes.
