water caused the child to slip from his grasp. Feeling lone attempts at rescue would be futile, Karpen clambered out and ran to Ormrod and summoned aid.

His plea for help was answered by Fred Agatz and Willard Guth, both employes of the cement company. With the aid of a rowboat and grappling iron they retrieved the body after searching nearly two hours.

Coroner A. M. Peters, M. D., pronounced death due to accidental drowning.

Surviving the boy are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Eberhardt, two brothers, Frank and Hugo and a sister, Helen, all of Ormrod; the grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Bauer, and Mr. and Mrs. Eberhardt, now in Europe; and the godparents, Mr. and Mrs. Ludwig Kobezsky, Philadelphia.
