

YOUTH DROWNS IN QUARRY POOL

Heart Attack Fatal to Crawford Co. Farmer While Swimming Near Galion.

BODY FOUND IN WATER

Three Companions Begin Search When They Miss Him as They Leave Water.

GALION, Aug. 16—Walter Elwood Nungesser, 21, a farmer of Jefferson township northeast of here, was drowned Sunday about 6:30 p. m. while swimming with friends in a stone quarry pool about three miles north of here.

Nungesser and three friends, Glenn Starling, Miss Marjorie Wertz and Miss June Cameron, all of Galion, had made up a swimming party at the pool, which is located off the North Market street road, near the Pennsylvania railroad tracks.

Starling and the two girls finished their swim and had left the pool when they noticed Nungesser missing. Going back to the pool, they found his body in the water.

A verdict that Nungesser had suffered a heart attack was returned by Dr. O. R. Kackley, Crawford county coroner.

Nungesser was born in Crawford county, March 10, 1916, to Aaron and Goldie Long Nungesser. He was graduated from the North Robinson High school in 1934, and was a member of the North Robinson grange and the Peace Lutheran church at Galion. Since graduation, he had been helping his father farm.

Surviving him are the parents and a sister, Edra, at home.

Private funeral services will be held Wednesday at 1:30 p. m. at the home and at 2:30 at the Peace Lutheran church. Rev. P. E. Auer will officiate, with burial in the Fairview cemetery.
