

YOUTH DROWNS IN OLD QUARRY

Holley—Shortly after completing school examinations at 10 a. m. yesterday a Holley High School freshman, Donald Green, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Green, drowned while taking a dip in a water-filled abandoned quarry near the village of Holley.

Green, Edward Bridgeman, a school chum, and two smaller boys, none of whom could swim, went to the quarry swimming hole which in some places is 30 feet deep.

Green entered the water first in a shallow spot but slipped. When he did not reappear immediately, Bridgeman ran to the school and summoned its principal, Carl Payne, and Karl Davis, physical training instructor. Both were unable to help.

Hamlin Beach Park CCC boys, who were working at a nearby project, were called by Camp Superintendent L. C. Hoban and they dived for the drowned youth.

Nicholas Andreaccio finally reached the body, which had been caught under a ledge about 20 feet below. He brought him ashore where artificial respiration was attempted. The Albion Fire Department pulmotor squad spent two hours trying to revive the youth.
