10 ARE KILLED IN STATE ACCIDENTS

Week-End Toll Includes Three by Drowning, Four in Traffic Mishaps

Ten persons were fatally injured in week-end accidents in Indiana as thousands thronged Hoosier highways and swimming centers for relief from the heat.

Traffic accidents claimed four lives as a man and a woman, both of Attica, were killed near Crawfordsville when the automobile in which they were riding collided with a truck and crashed into a tree; another man suffered fatal injuries near French Lick when his car crashed into a truck, and another was killed as he walked in the road near Cherubusco.

A Richmond youth drowned as a dozen swimmers nearby thought he was joking as he floundered, a man suffered a heart attack and sank in a creek near New Albany and an eleven-year-old boy drowned after falling into water in an abandoned mine shaft.

An aged man was killed by a train near Attica, and Ray Tuell, age thirty-six, an Indianapolis oil company executive, died of heart disease after a boat exploded in which he was riding in the Ohio river at Aurora...

Lockjaw, resulting from a cut on his foot, was fatal today to a seven-year-old Brazil boy.
