

## **FIVE YOUTHS DROWN IN TWO ACCIDENTS**

**Four Lose Lives While Swimming  
in Clay Mine Pit and One in  
Unused Quarry.**

St. Louis, June 13.—(AP)—Five 'teen-age youths drowned late today in two separate swimming accidents, four in an abandoned clay mine pit and one in an unused quarry.

The boys who drowned in the mine were:

Robert Hanneken, 11; Cosmo Famosa, 12; George Bruemmer, 11, and Joseph Stock, 11.

Vail Rhodes, 16, lost his life in the quarry.

The clothing of the first four was found on the bank of a pool by Joseph Pizzoni, who had gone there to swim. An abandoned bicycle lay nearby.

City firemen recovered the bodies from 15 feet of water, after several hours grappling.

John Harrison, a passerby, saw Rhodes struggling in the water and called help, but the boy sank. His body was recovered about 8:30 p. m.

All lived in St. Louis.
