From an abandoned water-filled quarry hole near Shamokin the body of John Nemith, 17, a pupil at the Kulpmont High School, was retrieved. He and two other boys who succeeded in saving themselves fell off an improvised raft.

York county recorded its first drowning of the season when John E. Gable, 18, died in the Susquehanna River, near Cly, when a boat in which he and five companions were rowing capsized.

Carl H. Butterbaugh, 16, of Bells Mills, Pa., lost his life while swimming in the Mahoning Creek near Punxsutawney, Pa.

Two chicken dealers rescued Mrs. Mabel Fox, 48, of S. Pine st., Bridgeton, N. J., after she had jumped or fallen into Clark's Pond, about five miles from Bridgeton. The two, Thomas Makriy and Thomas Reustle, both of Norma, N. J., saw her floating in the pond as they drove past in their automobile. They pulled her out and carried her to Bridgeton Hospital unconscious. Police said the woman has a husband and a son.
