

PRESCOTT BOY DROWNS IN ABANDONED QUARRY

Lebanon—Charles John Conlow, five, only child of Mr. and Mrs. Charles G. Conlow, of Prescott, was drowned at 5:30 p. m. Monday when he fell into an abandoned quarryhole.

The boy was playing with his cousin, Charles Duty, seven, Lancaster R5, and a neighbor, Shirley Kline, seven, of Prescott at the time of the accident.

The boy, his companions said, slipped on a stone at the edge of the abandoned Weiss quarry and plunged into twenty-five feet of water. The quarry is located about 300 feet from the Conlow home.

The Conlow boy is survived by his parents, his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Comp, Lancaster R5; a grandfather, Theodore Turns, Harrisburg, and a great grandfather, Robert Raffensberger, Hummelstown.
