gene Clifford Morgan, 19, of Locke, who was drowned last night in an abandoned rock quarry near here, was recovered this morning by an artatur diver, deputy sheriffs said.

Deputies and divers worked until midnight, then resumed dragging and diving operations about 5 a:m: today. The body was recovered about 6:15 a.m., the deputies said, in about nine feet of water at the popular swimming spot.

The Cayuga County coroner issued a verdict of accidental drowning this morning.

Slipped on Rock

Richard and Arthur trumpour of Locke, the youth's uncles, who accompanied him to the quarry last night, said he apparently slipped and hit his head on a rock as he fell into the water. Only Arthur Trumpour went swimming in the quarry as the other uncle is not a swimmer, deputies said.

Firemen identified the diver that found the body as Donald Cochrane of Lansing.

Born in Moravia, the youth lived in Locke 8½ years. He formerly atte dnhetde saFawEvvi merly attended the Moravia and Locke central schools, and at the time of his death he was employed by the Smith-Corona, Inc., plant in Groton.

Surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Morgan; three sisters, Elizabeth, Lorraine and Carla Morgan; two brothers, Bruce and Charles Morgan; his maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. George Trumpour, and his grandfather, John Morgan of Owasco.

Funeral services, being handled by the Wade Funeral Home, are incomplete.
