Twice Warned
Richard Kroetz and Kay Koester, life guards at the quarry, reported they had twice warned the youngster to stay out of the deep water area which is roped off to non-swimmers. The youngster could not swim ster could not swim.

Danny was in swimming in the quarry Sunday afternoon with his brothers, Charles 14, Frederick 12 and Terry 8, all sons of Mr. and Mrs. Norman Mortus of Route 163 between Oak Harbor and Port

Clinton.

The family called the young-sters in at 4:30 p.m. because the pool is closed down from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. It was at this time that Danny was discovered missing.

Six members of the Genoa Volume

unteer Fire Department under leadership of Chief Dan Cashen with the help of 75 people in the park conducted a search of the grounds for the missing youngster.

William Sutton, an underwater
swimmer from Toledo, and
Kroetz, the life guard, began a search of the water. At 6:30 p.m. Sutton discovered the boy's body in 15 feet of water just off the diving board. Resuscitation was

The body was taken to the Port Clinton funeral home. Dr. C. R. Wood, Ottawa county coroner, gave the verdict of accidental drowning.

Norman Mortus, the father, collapsed and was put to bed under physician's care. This marked the first Sunday Mr. Mortus has not worked for some time. Employed at the Cedar Point Marina, he had taken this Sunday off to take his family swimming.

The youth was a member of the fourth grade class of the Salem-Oak Harbor school.

He is survived by his parent Norman and Betty Chaffin Mortus, his brothers Charles, Frederick and Terry, his maternal grandparents Mr. and Mrs. William Chaffin and his paternal grandparents Mr. and Mrs. Louis Mortus, all of Port Clinton.
