

Three Drown In Accidents Over Indiana

A young man and two boys drowned in separate swimming and wading accidents in Indiana Wednesday.

Marshall H. Jackson, 22, a graduate student at Indiana University, drowned while swimming with two companions in Old Hunter quarry two miles west of Bloomington. The body was recovered two hours later.

Jackson's companions, Darrell W. Ference of Gary and Danny Seiters of Hoopston, Ill., both I. U. students, tried to rescue him when they saw he was in trouble, but they said he fought them and slipped from their grasp.

Jackson was attending summer school and was working on a master's degree in English. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Roy E. Jackson.

Lester Lee Boyd, 7, Fort Wayne, drowned while wading with two companions in the swift Maumee River in Fort Wayne. The body was recovered three hours later.

The boy apparently stepped into a hole and sank. Larry Cook, 9, and Ronald Edwards, 10, who were with him, told police they were unable to help him.

James Sparks, 14, Indianapolis, drowned while bathing in Wagon Wheel Lake, at the southeast edge of Marion County.

Two lifeguards, Ann Dewees, 16, and John Hamilton, 21, both of Indianapolis, pulled Sparks from the water. Miss Dewees applied artificial respiration for 45 minutes but could not revive him.
