

Youth Drowns In Abandoned Quarry

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (UPI) — John Caley, 12, Egypt, Pa., drowned in an abandoned cement quarry in Egypt Tuesday when he rescued his brother from the water, then dived again for a sneaker that had fallen from the younger boy's foot.

Police said Caley's brother, Jimmy, 8, fell into the water in the quarry in Whitehall Twp., about six miles from here, from an old raft.

Jeffrey Taylor, 12, one of a group of boys who were swimming, told police John came to the surface for air, then disappeared. Taylor said he jumped into the water to grab the victim but was forced to let go when he was pulled under by Caley, who panicked.

Harry Roth, a passerby,
