Bill Bridges, vice-commander of Hannibal's Mark Twain Emergency Rescue Squad, said many Hannibal youths play on the steep bluff sometimes digging their own caves.

"These boys have a history of digging. They were carrying a shovel when last seen," Bridges said.

He indicated another search would be made of Murphy's Cave.

Operations at Murphy's Cave were abandoned Friday morning after repeated sweeps through the narrow passages turned up no evidence of the boys, although playmates said they were seen entering.

Bridges planned to concentrate on an area of the cave that has been sealed by rockfalls during most of the search.

Two police dogs took their handlers to the base of the rockfalls on three occasions but could go no farther.

Rescue workers dug a new entrance to the cave on the far side of the cave-in but a search by underground teams turned up nothing.

Bridges said the Hannibal dog, Nemo, will be taken to the cave entrance again to see if he can pick up a scent.

The underground search is being conducted by members of the Speleological Society's underground rescue team.
