INTERRING THE REMAINS OF THE SAVANNA, I. T., MINERS.

**A Cunard Steamer Sinks a Smack and Two
Persons are Drowned—Two Men Fall
Seven Stories and are Instantly Killed in
New York—A Mississippi Fire.**

ST. LOUIS, April 7th.—The last of the miners of the Savanna, Indian Territory, mine disaster, who lost their lives by choke damp were taken from the mine this morning and buried, under the auspices of the I. O. O. F., K. of L., and Knights of Pythias. About 500 miners attended the funeral from McAlister. Four bodies of the victims of the explosion were recovered, but they are torn beyond recognition. Two others who were supposed to have been in the slope at the time of the explosion, were blown to atoms.
