

TWENTY WERE KILLED.

But Eleven Men Escaped From the Parral Mine.

Hinton, W. Va., Feb. 9.—It is now practically settled that there were Thirty-one men in the Parral mine near Oak Hill, Fayette county, when the explosion occurred there yesterday afternoon. Eleven were rescued alive, six bodies have been recovered and fourteen are in the mine.

Some of the rescued are badly injured and two will likely die. The dead bodies so far taken out are:

George Morris.

Ike Spears.

Hans Covia.

Jos. Hunter.

Joe Lumley.

One unidentified, all white.

Robert Gill, who was rescued alive, has both legs broken and Donald Bell is badly crushed. The men rescued alive were not in that part of the mine where the explosion occurred, which accounts for their rescue.

It is thought the remaining fourteen bodies can be gotten out tonight.
