

RESCUERS STILL BAFFLED BY FIRE BUT DON'T GIVE UP

Now Making Efforts in Amsterdam Mine to Wall in Fire

GOOD FIGHTING CHANCE TO RESCUE MINERS YET.

Amsterdam, O., Oct. 31.—“We have a good fighting chance of reaching the 20 miners entombed and we are fighting like hell to reach them.”

This was the declaration today of Supt. Richard Jones, of the ill-fated No. 2 coal mine, of the Youghiogheny and Ohio Coal Co., in which 20 miners have been entombed for 48 hours. He held out hope that some would be still be living when reached.

Amsterdam, Ohio., Oct. 31.—Still baffled by the raging flames that 48 hours have held back rescue of the entombed miners rescuers today started on a new plan to conquer the blaze and reach the point where twenty men have been entombed since 9 o'clock Wednesday morning.

The workers are endeavoring to wall in the burning area of the mine and construct a passage way to the point where their comrades are either dead or dying. Agonized relatives of the missing men still hope against hope that the entombed men are alive. Experienced mine rescue
