

6 Persons Die In Weekend Mishaps

ALBANY—(AP)—At least six persons lost their lives in upstate New York accidents over the weekend.

Two Buffalo fishermen were drowned yesterday, one in the Niagara river near the Peace bridge to Canada, and the other in Lake Erie.

William F. Ludka, 62, was lost when he slipped from the grasp of two companions, one of them his son, after the three had clung to their overturned boat in Lake Erie for an hour and a half.

Charles Tait, 30, was drowned in the Niagara river.

Other fatalities:

Mineville — Kenneth Goodspeed, 28, of Weatherbee, injured fatally when crushed by fall of rock at Republic steel mine.

Jamestown—Howard H. Culver, 28, of Randolph, truck left highway and struck telephone pole.

Jamestown—Richard Clark Ackerman, 19, automobile left highway and overturned.

Ithaca—Sandra Lee Lewis, one-year old daughter of Cornell university Tennis coach Richard Lewis, run-over by family car in yard of home.
