Republic Miners Die In Mine Shaft

Loose rock which poured down an open shaft at a Republic Steel Corp, mine at Mineville yesterday killed three men.

The reason for the accident was not determined, a company spakesman told the Associated Press.

Raymond Lavarnway, 30, of Mineville; Richard Hannett, 26, of New Russia, and Frank Petrowicz, 37, of Whiterbre were killed.

The rock fell from the mine's 200-foot level. The three dead men were standing on a platform at the 1,035 foot level when they were struck, a spokesman at the mine said.

The accident took place in the corporation's Harmony iron mine, located in Essex County near Port Henry.
