

Industrial accidents injure three here

A coal miner, crushed by a heavy piece of machinery, remained in critical condition Saturday after spending over 10 hours in the operating room.

Clarence Surell, whose age and address was unavailable, was injured Friday afternoon in Republic Steel's Virginia Mine. He was admitted to Carraway Methodist Hospital.

He was one of three persons injured Friday in industrial accidents in the Birmingham area.

Hospital attendants said a heavy piece of machinery crushed him against the mine wall.

Jack Thames, 27, of 4304 35th-av, n, was in "fairly good" condition Saturday at Jefferson Hospital. He was burned on his hands and side while at work at Sloss-Sheffield By-Products plant in North Birmingham.

Herbert Dudley, 34, of Warrior, was injured in a rock fall at a De-Bardeleben Coal Corp. mine near Warrior. Jefferson-Hillman Hospital attendants said his hand was crushed and thumb almost severed.
