

MINER KILLED

**Broken Rock Hurls New York
Man 200 Feet Down Ore Chute**

Lyon Mountain, N. Y. (AP) — A 41-year-old miner was killed yesterday when a piece of rock broke loose from the roof of a mine and hurled him down the chute he was climbing.

The victim was Clarence M. Miller of Ellenburg Depot.

State Police said Miller was climbing the chute 600-feet below ground in the Republic Steel Corp. iron-ore mine. The rock sent him 200 feet to a landing.
