FORTY-THREE STONES RECEIVED FROM GOVERNMENT FOR GRAVES OF SOLDIER DEAD

N. J. Hornbeck, officer of the day of Streater Post, G. A. R., has procured from the government at Washington forty-three headstones to mark the graves of old soldiers buried in Streater and in other neighboring graveyards.

The stones are each about 3 feet high, probably a foot wide and four inches thick. Each is adorned with scroll work and the names of the dead, the number of his company and his regiment and company are inscribed on the stone; also his rank if above that of a private.

Others May Get Them. Mr. Hornbeck asks the Free Press to state that he will undertake to procure a stone for the grave of any old soldier in this locality, who may have been overlooked in ordering the present supply. It will first be necessary, however, for the relatives or others interested to furnish the full name of the dead soldier, and the number of his company and his regiment. The government has this data on each stone and furnish the stone itself free.

Brother Level's Silent Tomb

Ledge in Third Vein Found Piled High With Dead--Estimated That Corpses Number 58--Four Feet of Water Impedes Progress--Fire Still in Second Level

(U. Press Ass'n's Dispatch.)
Cherry, Ill., Nov. 24--2:10 p. m.--Bodies estimated variously, but reported today by the rescuers from below as about 160, were found in the east side of the lower vein. Company records show that only eighty were in the lower vein when the fire broke out. Mystery surrounds the work of entering the lower vein since last evening. The definite accounts say the entire number of those still there are beneath the debris near the bottom of the shaftway in the air shaft.

The leaders of the rescuers today scoffed at the idea that the mine would be sealed again on account of the danger of explosion of white gas.

It is indicated that the men found today in the lower level had not perished as a result of the water poured down but had been killed by black smoke.

A number of dinner pails containing food and water were found near the corpses. It is believed they had been dead a week. It is believed the men being driven back by the fire, made an effort to reach the holding shaft.

Huddled on Ridges.
The bodies found today were huddled in a heap on a small ridge. There was not room for all. Those dying early were piled at the bottom of the ridge and those who died later were piled on top of them.

It is estimated today that there are 160 bodies at the lowest level. These figures have twenty-three men, unaccounted for.

There is said to be four feet of water in the third level.
