

Colliery Accident at Shamokin, Pa.
POTTSVILLE, Pa., June 10.—An accident occurred at the Henry Clay Colliery, at Shamokin, this afternoon, which was caused by the explosion of a keg of powder which communicated the fire to the stope in which were about 200 miners. At 7 o'clock 130 of the miners were rescued, eight of whom were dead. Twenty are supposed to be still remaining in the mine. At the time of the accident the inside foreman was exploring some of the works, when he set fire to the gas, causing the explosion.
