The Avalanche's Work.

Denver, 27.—Following is a list of the killed in the snowslide at the Mendota mine, near Telluride, on the 24th: J. H. Bond, C. S. Herrick, Thomas Dunegan, William Taylor, John Davis, William Applewhite, F. Slater, Lewis Huckene.

At Silverton a terrific wind storm set in on the 19th, raging furiously for six days. It proved the most disastrous to life ever known. Of five seriously injured at the Virginia mine on Friday three have since died, making nine in all. Yesterday a miner named Breet Walla was buried in a snowslide at the head of Clement Creek. He cannot be found till spring. Yesterday two men, whose names were not learned, were caught in a snowslide near Ironton and carried 15,000 feet down the side of a mountain. When extricated they were frozen from the waist down, the flesh opening in places. They cannot recover.

A train of twenty-five freight cars at Monument was overturned by high wind on the 25th and a number of cattle were killed.
