
Seven Miners Entombed.

POTTSVILLE, Pa., October 3.—An explosion of gas occurred in the Richardson colliery of the Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron company at Glen Carbor this evening and seven men are entombed in the gangway of the Crosby vein. One man was taken out dead and three others are fatally injured. The men are imprisoned behind a wall of rock which was brought down by the explosion. The accident occurred just before quitting time and the Richardson colliery being eight miles from here, details are not easily obtained. The names of the victims have not as yet been learned.

By an explosion in the Richardson Colliery last evening, John Magasky, a Polander was killed and James Grant and Thomas Coxville seriously injured. The men entombed in the mine are Thomas Clancy, married; John Lawler, married; James Simmons, Michael Welsh, married; John Purcell, fire boss, married; and Jno Cusick, a polander single. There is no hope of rescuing them alive.
