

TEN MEN DASHED TO PIECES.

Fell Over Three Thousand Feet Down a Mine Shaft.

HOUGHTON, Mich., May 15 --Ten men were dashed to pieces in the Red Jacket perpendicular shaft of the Calumet and Hecla mine while coming up in the cage to dinner. The engineer holsted the cage against the timbers of the shaft, the coupling pin broke and the men and cage were dashed downward over 3,000 feet to the bottom. The names of the killed are:

Allen Cameron, son of Captain Cameron, in charge.

James Cocking, single, supporting widowed mother.

Joseph Pope, leaves a wife and one child. The wife was at the mouth of the shaft with his dinner and saw the terrible fall of her husband and his comrades.

John Rodgers, leaves a wife and several children.

Josh Hicks, single, aged 24.

Andrew Fido, aged 40, married.

Robert Wuopla, leaves a wife and three children.

Michael Leavitt, widower.

James Trevi, leaves a wife and three children.

Con S. Sullivan, single, aged 40.

There was no way of reaching the bottom nor getting the dead men out except by going through another shaft half a mile away, so that it was nearly three hours before the true state of affairs could be ascertained, and it was toward morning before the bodies could be brought to the surface.
