
An Entombed Miner Rescued

Hazleton, Aug. 23.—Peter Liko, the miner who was entombed in the Cole-raine colliery yesterday, was taken out alive early this morning. He occupied the diving tomb fourteen hours. The work of rescuing was dangerous and exciting. To reach him the miners had to dig a trench fourteen feet deep through rock in order to get beneath him and not disturb overhanging boulders. Although no bones were broken he has since being taken to the hospital, been unable to move a muscle of his body. His escape from death seems miraculous.
