SIX DROWNED

AWFUL FATALITY IN A TUNNEL IN KASKA WILLIAM COLLIERY

Water Dashed in Upon Miners From an Old Working While the Men Were at Work

POTTSVILLE, May 27.-A dreadful mining casualty occurred at noon to-day at the Kaska William colliery, near Middleport, and a few miles east of Pottsville, in which six men were drowned by a body of water breaking in upon them from an old "working."

The names of the victims are: Peter Durkin, married; Carl Koskoskie, single; Vendel Kovitskie, married; Martin Molochin, married; William Morgan, aged 29 years, married, leaves a wife and two children; William Derr, single, aged 17 years.

The men were all tunnel men. Morgan was a loader boss and Derr a pump engineer.
