
ENTOMBED MINER SAVED.

Received Over the Mail's Leased Wire.

SALT LAKE, October 29.—After being entombed in the Highland Boy mine at Bingham, Utah, for sixty-one hours, Charles Nutting was taken out yesterday by the rescuing party that has been constantly at work since the cave-in occurred. He was alive, but very weak when found. The space in which he was imprisoned was so small that he was unable to stand up. A plentiful supply of fresh air, however, served to prolong life until yesterday, when he was taken out. One other man, William Anderson, is still in the mine, and the rescuing party will continue its work until he is found. There is no hope, however, of finding him alive.
