

TOMBSTONE ACCIDENT

**GEORGE POLLOCK BURIED FOR
THREE HOURS YESTERDAY.**

Miner, Rescued After Hard Work,
Was Not Very Badly Injured—Rock
Caved Upon Him Without Warning.

Tombstone, May 14.—George Pollock, a miner employed here, narrowly escaped death today, while working on the 600-foot level in one of the mines.

For three hours Pollock lay buried underneath several hundred pounds of rock, while hardy miners dug him out. All the time he suffered a great deal, but stood the ordeal bravely.

Pollock was at work in a winze when, without warning, a large part of the overhanging wall fell upon him. He tried to get out of the way, but the rock had him pinned down before he could take a step.

Through a miracle Pollock escaped serious injury. Had the rock fallen on his body a little higher up it would have crushed out his life in an instant.

As it is, Pollock escaped with slight bruises about the limbs. Late to night he was resting as easy as can be expected under the circumstances.
