HANNA MINE HORROR

Coroner's Inquest Over Bodies Victims Ends.

FIFTEEN WITNESSES HEARD

Eividence Falled to Place the Responsibility.

Finding That Several Were Suffocated by After-Damp-Others Were Killed by Explosion.

Rawlins, Wyo., Aug. 5.—The Coroner's inquest over the remains of the Hanna mine victims, which was begun Monday, was concluded about 10.20 last night. About fifteen witnesses were examined, but the evidence failed to place the responsibility.

The jury found that some of the victims were suffocated by the afterdamp consequent on an explosion which had occurred at the time before mentioned. The remainder were killed by the explosion, which was caused, as near as can be determined, by igniting in some manner unknown to the jury gases and other combustibles.
