

ENTOMBED MINER SAVED

After Nearly Seven Hours Imprisoned Man Is Freed

UPPER LEHIGH, Pa., July 28.—For nearly seven hours Andrew Wisda, a miner, was entombed in the Jeddo mines this afternoon, and was rescued alive. Wisda was working in a breast fifty feet up from the gangway, when a heavy fall took place below him. Up to within a few feet of where Wisda was at work the roof caved, choking the chamber and making a prisoner of the miner. Hearing his rescuers fattered and despite the danger volunteers were numerous and the entombed man was released at 6 o'clock tonight. He was unconscious when taken out, but soon revived in the air.
